It has been noted that this year we did not celebrate the Epiphany of Our Lord within the context of worship. Though it might seem like this was because of the shuffling of our holiday schedule due to the arctic weather, that was not the case.

The Epiphany of Our Lord always falls on January 6th. It is the 13th day after Christmas. Since the 4th century the festival has come to be associated with the visit of the Magi, to the Christ child, and their bearing of 3 gifts; gold, frankincense, and myrrh (Matt 2:1-12).

In the Orthodox Church the festival of Epiphany is seen as the second most important festival of the church year, only ranking below Easter. This is because in the story of the Magi, what we see is members of foreign nations (that is non-Jews in its 1st century context) recognizing & coming to the newly born savior.

You might be asking yourself "if Epiphany is so important, why did we skip it this year?" That is a fair question. The way our lectionary works the church week runs from Thursday to Wednesday. If a festival such as Epiphany, or the Ascension, falls on Monday through Weds it can be celebrated on the prior Sunday. If the festival lands on Thursday through Saturday, it can be celebrated on the following Sunday.

As Praise Board gathered to plan the Christmas Season and time after, we decided to follow the lectionary as printed for the Sundays at hand; celebrating first the Name of Jesus on 1/1 then the Baptism of Our Lord on 1/8. That is the part that was disrupted because of the Christmas weekend ice storm.

Have no fear though, the season of Epiphany provides us a wonderful time to travel with the Magi, pondering the ways that we follow Christ in our lives, and contemplate the gifts that we bring.
