A LETTER FROM PASTOR

The Sunday between the 5th Sunday of Lent and Easter has a bit of a complicated history. Recent memory might recall that day called either "Palm Sunday" or "Passion Sunday." The story I'd heard was that it was traditionally Palm Sunday, the triumphant entry setting the stage for Holy Week, and preparing us for the the institution of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday, the crucifixion on Good Friday, and resurrection on Easter morn. However, as congregations became less and less willing to come out for all the events of Holy Week, Palm Sunday became problematic as worshipers would shout in joy one Sunday, and sing "Hallelujah!" the next. If they missed Good Friday, they missed the crucifixion. This created the confusing reality of Jesus' resurrection being a surprise, since they missed his death. The logical liturgical adaption was to shift Palm Sunday to Passion Sunday so that congregations would get the entire story palms to tomb. This way they had the option of celebrating Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, though if they couldn't make it, they would still have heard the whole story.

This story, though logical, overlooks the actual history.

Until 1959 the Fifth Sunday of Lent was officially known in the Roman Catholic Church as Passion Sunday and marked the beginning of "Passiontide." At this time, Lent, like Advent, had 4 Sundays. Passiontide was a season within a season, leading up to Easter that included: Passion Sunday, "Lazarus Saturday", and the entirety of Holy Week. This two week period allowed congregations to prepare for, and live through, the journey of Holy Week and in turn create a bigger build for the festivities of Easter.

What we call the Fifth Sunday of Lent, was the First Sunday of Passiontide. What we call Palm/Passion Sunday, was the Second Sunday of Passiontide.

It was in the years leading up to Vatican II that the Second Sunday of Passiontide. It was in the years leading up to Vatican II that the Second Sunday of Passiontide was lengthened to the "Second Sunday of the Passiontide or Palm Sunday." After Vatican II, the "First Sunday of the Passiontide" was changed to the "Fifth Sunday of Lent." With that change the "Second Sunday of the Passiontide or Palm Sunday" became simply "Passion or Palm Sunday."

Parts of this tradition have left their fingerprints on our liturgy.

This year on the Fifth Sunday of Lent (3/26) we heard John's account of the resurrection of Lazarus, the standard reading on "Lazarus Saturday" during the first week of Passiontide.

In the Service Book & Hymnal (the old Lutheran "red book" published in 1958) there were 6 Sundays of Lent, followed by Holy Week, then Easter.

In the Lutheran Book of Worship (the "green book" published 1978) the 5 Sundays of Lent were followed by "Sunday of the Passion/*Palm Sunday*."

Is one of these approaches better than the others?


Should it be Palm Sunday, Passion Sunday, or part of the two week Passiontide? I believe what's most important is that we are prepared to celebrate the good news we find at the empty tomb.

I think whether we take 1 week, 2 weeks, or one Sunday to prepare ourselves, that we arrive with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary. Those first witnesses were prepared to mourn as they headed to the tomb to check on the body of Christ, when Jesus surprised them.

Regardless of the length of our celebration, may we too be prepared for what we expect, and for Jesus to surprise us. Paston Hille

As a result of some large, one-time offerings, we ended the month of February with a surplus of \$4,604. Our year-to-date deficit is only \$124, compared to a budgeted deficit of \$4,952. Our balance in the Operating Fund stands at \$21,367, which probably means it will be several months before we need to tap into other unrestricted funds in order to pay for operating expenses.

Offerings to other funds and causes during February included: <u>Loan Fund</u>, \$795; <u>Then, Now, Forever</u> <u>Fund</u>, \$440; <u>Cause of the Month</u> (Faith Mission Shoe Drive), \$1,665, and <u>LSS Souper Bowl Sunday</u>, \$1,311.
