### A LETTER FROM PASTOR

I'm currently reading "These Hundred Years: The Centennial History of Capital University" a written account of the birth of the university from its inception as a function of a German seminary on S. High St. to its current location in Bexley. Though the history of board meetings, faculty disputes, and synodical politics may not be everyone's cup of tea, the authors (yes multiple) do a wonderful job of writing this account in a way that is narratively engaging.

I'm reminded of an idea I've seen written in other historical texts. Simply put, the fingerprints of the founders always remain on the community they establish. Consider the diversity in Ohio between Cleveland, Columbus, and Cincinnati. One is a port city, one began as a farm town, and the other is adjacent to the Appalachian Mountains. Despite all of them being in Ohio, these cities are the products of their original settlers. "These Hundred Years" tells the tale of the men whose fingerprints are all over Capital University, and many whose names are on the buildings.

It's somewhat serendipitous, that while reading about the formation of that institution, I've also been diving into the history of Faith Lutheran Church. Thumbing through old directories and photo albums, lovingly and painstakingly created by members current and past, I can see the fingerprints of the founders of this congregation. People who began a Bible study in a house on Maplewood Ave. and had a vision that in 1953 would be set in stone with the cornerstone of our sanctuary. Their fingerprints are on our mission; "Sharing and celebrating the Good News of Jesus Christ so that all people will know Him." Their fingerprints exist in the memories of generations who have come to this place to be loved, educated, fed, cared for, and reminded that God loves them.

The halls of Faith Lutheran Church, like buildings at Capital University, are adorned with the names of people who dedicated their lives to the lives that were transformed here. These are names also written into countless stories that I've heard in Bible study, Sunday School, coffee hour, and other visits.

I believe it's true that institutions always carry the fingerprints of their initial creators. I also believe that institutions are formed by the generations that follow, the ones who shape, support, and continue to grow those initial ideas into different realities over the years. We have been blessed beyond measure by the vision of a Bible study on Maplewood Ave., and the generations of members and pastors since. In this, our current expression of Faith Lutheran Church, it is a joy and a privilege to be part of our ministries today, events that will live on in memories shared tomorrow. Sharing such a rich history gives us the opportunity to look at the past and find support and encouragement in the simple fact that everything we know as Faith Lutheran Church grew out of a simple Bible study.

If so much could come from so little, what else can we grow out of the ministry we share today?

The deficit for August was \$4,907, compared with a budgeted deficit of \$2,476, or an additional \$2,431. Although expenses were below budget, offerings were below budget by \$3,218. At the end of August, the balance in the Operating Fund was \$2,249.

August offerings for other funds included \$400 for <u>Cause of the Month</u> (Center of Hope), \$771 for the <u>Property (Loan) Fund</u>, and \$255 for the <u>Then</u>, <u>Now</u>, <u>Forever Fund</u>.
