A LETTER FROM PASTOR

Dear Partners in Ministry,

Over the last few weeks, the Saturday emails have intentionally looked different both in content & form. It has been my goal to invite you to consider giving as integral to the life of the congregation, as well as an act of worship and support. This lengthy ongoing conversation is a different approach to giving.

In years past, members would receive a letter focused on giving and the upcoming year's budget that would contain an Intended Giving card. Church trends across the country show this approach leads to both positive and negative results. On one hand, Intended Giving cards are returned to help the council create the following year's budget. On the other hand, there is generally low attendance on "Giving Sunday" as trends show some people don't like that outward display of giving and commitment. It's a fascinating correlation.

Enclosed in this month's newsletter you will find a 2024 Intended Giving card. If you would like to be part of the Procession of Pledge Cards, you are invited to do so on Sunday Nov. 19th. If processing is "not your thing" please mail in your card, drop it in the offering plate the week before or after, or visit the church's Vanco page for online giving. Links to our online giving site are also located both in the Saturday emails and on the church website. Intended Giving cards will also be located in the pews, since your intended gifts enable our council to create the budget for the upcoming year. However you choose to signify your gift, thank you for your continued generosity that sustains our ministry together.

In December the council will once again gather to draw up an intended budget for the upcoming year. Again, thank you for your generous gifts that make Faith Lutheran Church a reality. Every dollar you give will be used to support the many and various ministries of Faith. From feeding neighbors at Taco Sunday and providing a voting location in Whitehall, to gathering for worship and providing an online Bible study, our general budget is the fiscal bloodline for all the ministries we provide. Thank you for your support.

It's true that the fiscal realities for congregations the size of Faith are hard across America. It's also true that we are not an exception. As we draw closer to the 100th anniversary of Faith in 2027 lots of conversations & time has been spent at council discussing ways to further create, develop, & support the ministries of our congregation.

One step we will take together is the development of a strategic plan. This will be built by the congregation together in planning sessions during Adult Forum. Though each strategic plan is unique to its context, there are similarities in how all are developed. First we will look to celebrate and learn from the rich history of Faith exploring our current sense of identity and the mission to which God is calling us. Then, we will explore our neighbors & neighborhood, identifying the context in which God has called us to live out our mission. Finally, we will chart a course for our future rooted in this understanding of our mission, our context, and ourselves.

We are looking to create this plan before summer, visioning the course for the years leading up to our 100th anniversary in 2027.

Your generous gifts allow us to boldly and confidently chart our course to the future that God is calling our ministry too.

Whether you give online or in person, thank you for your gifts that secure our future. Whether you walk forward on Nov. 19th or put a stamp on a letter, your action of giving is essential in giving Faith a future.

The deficit for September was \$3,836, compared with a budgeted deficit of \$2,476. While expenses have remained within budgeted amounts in 2023, offerings have not. In fact, average monthly offerings have declined as the year has progressed. With a continuing series of monthly deficits, even greater than what was budgeted, the balance in the Operating Fund was exhausted in September. We transferred \$2,000 from the Legacy Fund to keep a small positive balance (\$413) in the Operating fund.

September offerings for other funds included \$1,000 for the Legacy (Memorial) Fund, \$520 for Cause of the Month (Lutheran World Relief), \$1,625 for the Property (Loan) Fund, and \$655 for the Then, Now, Forever Fund.
