A LETTER FROM PASTOR

I know this might sound early, but.... are you ready for Easter?

Typically I would not present such a question in the March issue of a church newsletter. As I learned from my teachers, and my teacher's teachers, the journey of Lent is to be experienced and appreciated, so to run ahead to Easter is to rob Lent of its due.

This year however, Easter comes early- March 31st, in fact.

Easter occurs on the Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox, which welcomes spring in the northern hemisphere. The range of dates for Easter falls between March 22nd to April 25th. With only 10 of the 31 potential dates of Easter being in March, April is more often the home of the festival.

This got me wondering, when was the last time Easter was in March?

It was eight years ago on March 27, 2016. It was my final Easter at my first call parish in

Connecticut. Pastor Moehring was at Faith leading this community.

What was your life like then? What do you remember?

The last time Easter fell on March 31st was three years before that in 2013.

What was your life like there? What do you remember?

As we reminisce, we are provided an interesting phenomena to selectively revisit. When doing so, people often first consider the best memories of the era, the "good times", and then the monumental experiences such as the death of a loved one, loss of a job, etc. Those memories tend to be cradled in the memories of the others who that time was shared with; the people who offered friendship, love, and support throughout difficult and trying times. The smallest details are often the hardest to draw to mind. The specific daily occurrences and the nuances of each moment, albeit the hardest to recount, all happened and helped shape who we are today. In truth there are probably more minute details from 2013 that we can't remember, than large events we can. And yet, every one of those details, every decision made, every breath taken has been part of the journey which brought us to this moment, to today.


It's easy to turn our attention to Easter this year, March 31, 2024, overlooking Lent to begin the considerations of all the festivities, guests, and the pomp & circumstance of The Resurrection of Our Lord.

Though here's an interesting tidbit; the next time Easter will fall on March 31st will be 2086. Grayson Annable, who was baptized at Faith just last year at 5 months old, will be 63. On that day, many of us might not have the opportunity to reminisce on the last Easter on March 31st. Let's take the time to intentionally remember, with great joy and detail this month of March, this journey of Lent, and this season together.

Easter will come and bring with it the familiar exclamation that "He is risen!" as we meet those first witnesses at the empty tomb. We will again celebrate the defeat of death in our congregations, until the time comes in which we will stand among those cloth in white.

I hope and pray that you enjoy *this* moment, this month, & this season. I hope these days are filled with intentionality as we journey with the wild beasts & the angels across these 40 days. Maybe the question should be, "are you getting ready for Easter, and savoring every moment?"

- A home visit from Pastor Risch after attending one Sunday. He was the only pastor who bothered or took the time to make me feel welcome. This made me want to join the family of Faith with my family.
- In the 70s high school retreats w/ 60+ participants
- Shirley Kicker paid a call on me at home a week or two after I started coming here. Church members paid calls.
- Hearing Susan's beautiful voice for the first time, getting married to Susan in the sanctuary. What an overwhelming blessing.
- Pastor Risch made a hoe visit to establish rapport when I joined Faith for the first time in 1989 (Margaret Hall)
- Paul & I came to Faith Church in the fall of 1959. Dave Risch was pastor, and Don Bensch called on me to invite us. We/I have been a member since then. Earliest faith memory is of nursery Sunday School teacher Ida Rouchman.
- Joined in 1960 when I was baptized. Dave Risch was pastor: maybe CT Langholz was on staff too visitation pastor? I remember having 3 services on a Sunday. In early-mid 1970s I was one of the first female acolytes.
- Getting the carnation from an usher after church on Sunday, Luther league, opportunities to sing, memorizing Luther's small catechism, a place where my kids could leave my sight and I was comfortable with that. Someone had an eye on them. Another "family" for me and my parents, sister, husband, and children. Provide special music and Christmas and in the summer. Reciting my father's sermon on Christmas Eve.
- November 26, 1961 joined Faith. Dave Risch baptized me. Confirmed May 15, 1976 by Dave Risch. Married November 26, 1994, Jim Schaaf and Peter Ray married me.
- My family and I started attending Faith in 1978. Pastor Risch was the senior pastor at that time. I was confirmed in May 1980.

- I joined in 1998? Pastors were Mark Nodo & Eric Moehring

- Attending VBS as a child, becoming a member, 3 weddings (mine, & my 2 daughters), 3 funerals (my husbands, my in-laws), baptisms of children and grandchildren, confirmations, making dear lifelong friends and losing them.
- Attending Sunday School at East Main Street School, Reverent Wagner, Pastor Langholtz, housing the homeless, years of trimming trees, bushes, and weeding, teaching bible school, when the overflow was needed, the Christmas Eve service done at last minute by Pastor Risch and Karen Southward, of course the pastor that truly had the greatest impact in my christian life. Pastor Risch and Alberta Pottorff.
- Being a member sincere birth, I have learned all I know from pastors, Sunday School teachers, confirmation teachers, my parents, members, mentors, and friends in this congregation.
- I want to share my faith because I cannot imagine the emptiness a person must have that does not know God or have a church family.
- It comforts me in times of loss and enhances appreciation in times of awareness of abundant blessings. I want to share my faith with others because of the comfort it brings to people in times of sorrow and poor health.
