Summer is here, and with it comes calendars stuffed with vacations, time off, cookouts, parades, and the third installation of our Run to Church 5k!

We launched our race in 2022 as a community fundraiser for Lutheran Social Services and all the work that they do feeding people across our city. Last year the proceeds of the race stayed in Whitehall as we sent them to the Center Of Hope located just around the corner on Main St.

This year our recipient will be ETSS Tewahedo Social Services. ETSS has a long history of working with the Ethiopian immigrant and refugee community in Central Ohio. ETSS works tirelessly to provide adult services, youth programming, and resettlement support to the more than 40,000 Ethiopians who call the Columbus metropolitan area home.

It is a great source of pride for me that because of our generous sponsors every single dollar we receive from registration goes to that year's identified charity partner. The previous two years there was also a sponsor surplus that was added to our charity donation amount.

Our focus on community partners has changed how I talk about our race in the community. I used to tell people that Run To Church is, "a church race for a charity" but now I invite people to "a community charity race at a church." It's a small difference in the order of the words, though I've seen first hand people respond to it better.

I think when people hear "church race" they think, "why would I support a church I don't go to?" I had a potential runner ask me, "so what is it for, do you need a new roof or something?" However when I lead with the charity goal of the race I notice that people listen more and ask follow up questions about the charity connection first, then about the time, date, and location of the event.

Part of this is a culture shift we see when considering church engagement in broad strokes. There are some people who will do "church things" simply because they are "church things." More people I run into however are actively looking for community engagement & connectivity and will do "community things" simply because they are "community things."

This month consider how you invite your neighbors, friends, and family to this year's Run To Church.

Any invitation is better than no invitation, that is certainly true. Though for those who might be reticent or shy of church, an invitation to a community event with free coffee and hotdogs, that benefits our Ethiopia neighbors might make it on their calendar quicker than simply an invitation to come to a church.....

Commentary:

In the month of April, we had a deficit of \$3,924 in the Operating Fund, which is \$1,325 more than budgeted. Expenses were slightly less than budgeted, but offerings were \$1,389 lower than anticipated. However, our year-to-date deficit of \$2,160 is significantly lower than our budgeted deficit of \$10,390. Although the balance in the Operating Fund declined during April, we still had a positive balance of \$2,257 in the fund at the end of the month.

During April, \$4,473 was spent from the Memorial Fund as partial payment for new exterior doors that will be installed at the Elm Street entrance.

April offerings for other funds included \$365 for Cause of the Month (Another Child Foundation), \$846 for the Property (Loan) Fund, and \$301 for the Then, Now, Forever Fund.


