I was recently at the Southern Ohio Synod office when I was asked, "How is the ministry of Faith going?" It's a wonderful kind of check in question that allowed me to brag about increased runners & volunteers at this year's Run to Church 5k, the completion & opening of our Infant Clothing Closet, our new Youth Room, various Veteran outreach programs, and on-going "Cause of the Month" initiatives. This was also before last weekend's Trunk-or-Treat that saw 50-60 community members come out to enjoy the candy, tacos, and options.

The next question I was asked surprised me a little, "and how is your ministry?" I was surprised because I see my ministry as the ministry of Faith Lutheran Church. The question that was really being asked however was more about my ministry in the Whitehall community beyond our community of faith, at Faith.

I've been thinking about that second question a lot over the last few weeks. On one hand there's our parish located at 730 Collingwood Ave., on the other hand the community is our parish at large. Throughout our strategic planning sessions earlier this year I heard loud and clear, "we want more people in worship!" I share that desire, and like many of you I tirelessly ponder & plan ways to welcome others into Sunday morning. Though in light of the questions asked to me at the Synod office, what I see is two parishes with a thin veil between them; the church & the community. In 2020 when the basement flooded, community partners came out to help us clean it up. Over the past year both 2 Tones Brewing and Ethiopian Tewahedo Social Services have called up Faith to help them with community projects. On November 5th community members will walk into Faith as their polling place for the 2024 election.

The veil is thin.

Friends, it is the season when we begin to prepare next year's budget. Churches are a peculiar reality, unless there is a new parking lot, roof, or addition, there are rarely objects we can point at to say that "that is what we did last year."

So take a moment and consider the new faces you've seen at Taco Sunday, the 5k, Trunk-or-Treat, or visiting in worship. Think about all those that stepped into the sanctuary at 730 Collingwood Ave. to commemorate and celebrate the lives of those that they loved and have lost along the way. Flip through old newsletters and look at the new additions to our "Cause of the Month" ministry in 2024.

Our goal at the end of 2023 was to engage more with the neighborhood and welcome more people into our assembly. We have faithfully done that to the best of our ability.

The numbers on a Sunday morning might not look too different than November 2023, however the veil between our parish and our parish is razor thin.

Your continuous gifts and sustained giving help us pierce that veil.

In 2025 we will continue to support our nearly 100 year old mission of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ so that all people may know Him. We will also ensure that we are here to care for the immigrants (with E.T.S.S), feeding the hungry (Taco Sunday & Free Little Pantry), and provide a sanctuary from the world outside, as Christ calls us to do.

We will end our liturgical year on Christ the King Sunday (Nov. 24th) with our procession of 2025 pledge cards. Before we cross over from one liturgical year to the next, take a moment to consider how you can support our mission together as we continue to reach beyond ourselves, through the veil, and welcome all into this community that we love so much.

For September, we had a deficit of \$464, which was about \$1,300 less than the budgeted deficit. Offerings were slightly greater than expected, and expenses were nearly \$1,000 lower than expected. On a year-to-date basis, our results are better than anticipated; our deficit so far this year of \$12,361 is about \$8,500 lower than expected and about \$10,700 lower than at the same point last year.

Although our September deficit was small, we did transfer \$500 from the Young Fund to give us a small positive balance in the Operating Fund.

September offerings for other funds included \$1,126 for the <u>Property (Loan) Fund</u>, \$536 for the Then, Now, Forever Fund, and \$300 to the Veterans Fund.
