Back on October, 29 2024 our Tuesday Bible Study began studying the book of Revelation. This month (on Tuesday, May 6) we will conclude our study as we read the last chapter of that book. The book of Revelation is often confusing, presented as more terrifying than hopeful, and containing more judgement than gospel. My favorite commentary on Revelation is Richard L. Jeske's "Revelation For Today: Images of Hope." For me, Jeske's title wonderfully underlines what Revelation is... an image of hope and fulfillment of Christ's promises.

There's something poetic and beautiful about reading the last two chapters of Revelation during the season of Easter. As we gather for worship in the shadow of the empty tomb this season, John of Patmos' words paint a picture of what God's coming looks like.

In many ways it's a retelling of Genesis, the chaos of creation followed by God's eternal dwelling with humanity. There are some differences. In the words of Revelation we see clearly who Jesus is- the lamb who was slain. In the new creation that comes down from heaven there is no serpent, or evil, no wickedness or corruption.

In this vision all things are made new—not replaced. As existence is made new, some things will be discarded.

Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away. (Rev. 21:4)

The "first things" are sin, death, pain, mourning, dementia, addiction, heartache, health issues, loss, and sadness, just to name a few. They are the things that exist in our world and cause us to mourn & struggle.

The miracle of Easter is the first step to God's new and perfect creation founded on Jesus Christ; the first born of all creation (Colossians 1:15) and firstborn from the dead (Revelation 1:5).

I pray that in this season of Easter you find joy in the miracle at the empty tomb, and take comfort in the promises of hope that Christ has made with his life, death, and resurrection. These are the promises that pull us into God's forever & ever...



We had a healthy surplus of \$3,040 in March, which trimmed our year-to-date deficit to \$2,915. Although we are behind last year's position, we are performing better than projected. However, results tend to vary by month, with larger deficits in the summer months, so it's helpful to have better financial results in the early months of the year. The March 31 balance in the Operating Fund was \$23,174

March offerings for other funds included \$3,395 for <u>Cause of the Month</u> (Global Refuge), \$936 for the Property (Loan) Fund, and \$400 for the <u>Then</u>, <u>Now</u>, <u>Forever Fund</u>.
